Another Outbreak for Chipotle

Just when the lines were getting too long at Chipotle again,

647 people self-reported gastrointestinal symptoms after consuming food from Chipotle restaurant on Sawmill Parkway in Ohio between July 26-30. Food samples from the restaurant in question and stool samples from the people who ate there initially tested negative for clostridium perfringens bacteria. However, follow-up tests conducted by the CDC *show* that's what made consumers ill. Confirmation test results on the food are still pending.



Clostridium perfringens are bacteria that produce toxins that are harmful to humans. They are found everywhere in the environment, but human infection is most likely from eating food that contains the toxin itself. It is often mistaken for the 24-hour-flu even though in some cases it can last 1-2 weeks. The most common sources of the toxin are cooked meat products such as stews, casseroles, and gravy.

In response to this outbreak, Brian Niccol, CEO of Chipotle Mexican Grill stated, "Chipotle Field Leadership will be retraining all restaurant employees nationwide beginning next week on food safety and wellness protocols".

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Parasitic Outbreak Case Count Continues to Climb

As of August 24, 2018 507 patients have been confirmed as testing positive with microscopic cyclospora parasites. The outbreak itself spans 15 states. The states involved are as follows: CT, FL, IA, IL, KY, MI, MN, MO, NE, OH, SD, TN, VA, and WI. The majority of cases were seen in Illinois with a whopping 246 cases confirmed. The FDA continues to work and investigate where the outbreak started. Thus far, it has been traced to salad mix distributed by Fresh Express. The salad mix was also sold at select McDonald's restaurants. The FDA is still unsure what specific food in the salad mix was the source of contamination. An important note is that Fresh Express reported to the FDA that some of its customers other than McDonald's received salad mixes with some common ingredients. However, McDonald's was the only entity to receive salad mix that contained carrots. The CDC

reported that the case count could continue to climb despite McDonald's pulling the product in question as it can take up to six weeks after consuming the parasite before symptoms develop.




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There about 5 different types of mice and rats in your home... Well hopefully not your home!
