C.A.S.A. Highlights One of its Presenters, and New Member, Lieutenant Junior Grade Sarah A. Meehan, USPHS

The U. S. Public Health Service (USPHS) is one of the seven primary uniformed services of the United States. The **Environmental Health Officers** in the Commissioned Corps ensure public health and safety. "We accomplish that mission in a variety of domestic and international roles, and work areas are diverse and numerous," said LTJG Meehan. They include epidemiological surveillance, disease prevention, radiological health, industrial hygiene, food safety, injury prevention and education,

and emergency preparedness. During natural disasters, and other emergencies, USPHS environmental health officers protect the public from environmental threats and help communities recover.

LTJG Meehan is originally from Valier, Montana and graduated from the University of Montana with a Bachelor of Science in Chemistry. She first worked as an Environmental Health Specialist at the Allegheny County Health Department, Food Safety Division in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. In 2008, she secured a position as a Consumer Safety Officer with the Food and Drug Administration in Jamaica, New York. During that time, LTJG Meehan earned her Master of Science degree, in Environmental & Occupational Health Science at Hunter College School of Public Health, and soon after received a commission in the active duty component of the USPHS, maintaining assignment at the FDA and was soon promoted to New York District's Food Specialist.

"New York City is a great place to live, and work in public health," said LTJG Meehan. "My family enjoys all of the experiences that New York City has to offer, especially during the summer months. My husband and I enjoy taking our two-year-old son Jack to the Bronx Zoo, the Museum of Natural History, and Central Park. We also like to attend sporting events in our free time (go Knicks!)," said LTJG Meehan.

I have not yet had the opportunity to deploy either on a public health mission, or a humanitarian mission with USPHS; however, that was one of the reasons I wanted to go active duty, and I look forward to future opportunities to do just that. Directions to FDA facility:

The FDA building is easily accessible from the Van Wyck Expressway (678) from either north or south. Exit at Liberty Ave. and proceed east for approximately 1 mile. The building will be located on the north side of Liberty Ave. just beyond the Long Island Railroad trestle. Enter through the main gate, identify yourself and announce that you are attending the NY CASA meeting. You will be directed where to park. Enter through the main entrance and proceed to the main floor conference room.
